

CONDITIONS OF PLAY – FOURS

In addition to the requirements of the Guide to Competitors, the following Conditions of Play will apply:

1. TEAM WITHDRAWALS

Should a team have to withdraw from the Fours Championship before the commencement of the tournament Secretary must be advised immediately.

2. FORMAT OF PLAY

The Fours Championship is to be played on the league system in sections of 6 teams. Five rounds will be played starting on Friday 8 June 2012, morning and afternoon, until Sunday morning 10 June 2012. There will be a tea break during the morning game and no tea break for players in the afternoon games.

A Section playoff as directed by the Tournament Official will be played on the Sunday Afternoon 10 June 2012.

3. SCORECARDS

The names of the players for each team, in their positions, are to be clearly entered on the scorecard.

The scores are to be recorded on the scorecards and scoreboards after each end completed. At the conclusion of the game the scorecard signed by both Skips shall be handed to the Technical Official for verification.

4. SCORING OF GAME RESULTS

Two points will be awarded for a win game and one point for peeled game.

In the event of a points tie after the initial five rounds of Sectional play, winners shall be determined on the net total shots as defined in clause 1.3.22 of the Laws of the Sport of Bowls. Should there still be equality, clause 44.4 will apply, in that "The Controlling Body will divide the total shots scored against each team into the total of shots it has scored. The team with the highest result will be declared the winner". Should equality still exist the winner of the game between the contesting teams will be declared the winner. Should that game show equal scores, a deciding end will be played by the contesting teams.

5. TEAM PLAYERS

The players of a team may be altered prior to the commencement of the tournament. No alteration or addition to teams as declared will be allowed after the start of play in the first round. Players of a team may not change the position of play during a game that has commenced.
